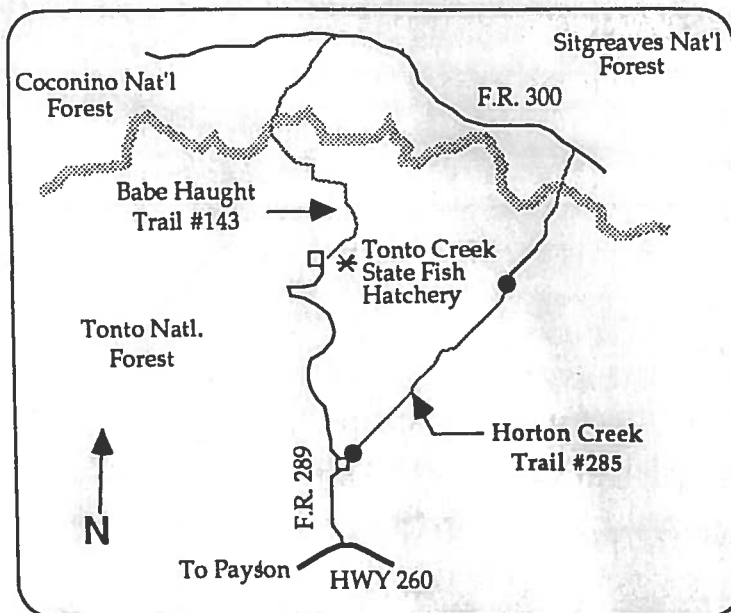

TRAIL DESCRIPTION: To arrive at Horton Creek Trail # 285, go about 16 miles northeast of Payson on Hwy 260 to Forest Road 289. The trail begins at the Upper Tonto Creek Campground approximately one mile from the intersection of Hwy 260 and F.R. 289. The trail runs along Horton Creek to its origin at Horton Spring. At the Spring and the Highline Trail, it joins Horton Spring Trail #292. The trail runs between F.R. 289 and the Highline Trail. Users may continue on the Horton Spring Trail to F.R. 300 for a total length of 4.7 miles.
